The Catholic Foundation of the Spokane Diocese provides supplemental financial assistance to Catholic and Catholic-affiliated agencies, institutions and programs, as well as local parish projects, within the Diocese of Spokane. Each year earnings from investments of the Foundation assets become available for grant distribution through two endowments, the Catholic Community Outreach Endowment and the Religious Education Endowments. In order to qualify for a grant, you must verify that your program meets the following criteria:

**I.**

- A. Is your organization a religious, educational or charitable work affiliated with the Catholic Church?
- B. Is your program located within the geographic area served by the Catholic Diocese of Spokane?
- C. Is your organization listed in the Official Catholic Directory, or does it have a tax-exempt status as a 501 (c) (3) entity?

**II. Grants are *not* made for the following:**

- A. Prior incurred debt
- B. Direct aid to individuals
- C. Contributions to general fundraising campaigns
- D. Medical research
- E. Endowment funds and other foundations
- F. Continuing operational support
- G. Multi-year grants

**III.**

For purposes of this application form, the word “project” is used in a generic sense and applies to all grant funding requests received by the Foundation.

**IV.**

Religious Education grants will be given to programs that serve children and youth, from pre-school through high school levels and adult education. The following are the priorities for religious education grants:

1. Preference for the poor
2. Preference for projects that serve multiple persons or groups
3. Strengthening of religious education and youth programs:
  - A. Training of catechetical and youth leaders. (Leaders are defined as those in charge of religious education and youth programs; training could include tuition.)
  - B. Training of catechists and youth workers. Training could include visual aids and materials.

Materials or programs that enhance religious education and youth ministry programs (materials must be on the Diocese’s list of approved publishers)

Parish or multiple parish adult enrichment programs including Lay ministry formation.

**V.**

The Board of Trustees of the Catholic Foundation has established priorities for grants from the Catholic Community Outreach Endowment. Programs which build up community, support the common good, encourage evangelization or foster the well-being of families will have priority in receiving funding. Multiple parish programs are encouraged.

Examples of programs meeting these priorities might be programs which:

- enhance or develop parenting skills;
- address needs of persons who have lost a spouse;
- educate couples through retreats / workshops;
- train lay leaders and ministers;
- repair, renovate or build worship or meeting facilities;
- assist those in need;
- address special needs of single parents;
- evangelize adults;
- begin or enhance youth ministry in parishes.

**VI.**

Applications must be postmarked no later than February 12, 2010.

B. Each of the 8 sets of your grant application must include the following in order as follows:

1. The Foundation original grant application form, completed & signed;
2. A copy of the questions answered as stipulated in the application form
3. One copy of your organization’s current financial report or the most recent annual report;
4. One copy of your organization’s projected budget;
5. A roster of your Board/officers;
6. A copy of descriptive brochures, if available;
7. A copy of the tax-exempt status letter, if applicable.

**VII.**

Grants are approved on a year-to-year basis only and are **not** automatically renewable. Multi-year requests are not considered by the Foundation.

**VIII.**

Recipients of Foundation grants are required to submit two reports during the grant year. Reports are due on December 31 and May 14 of the grant year. Report forms will be provided by the Catholic Foundation.

**IX.**

The Foundation Distribution Committee will review all grant applications and submit its recommendations to the Board of Trustees. Applicants will be notified in writing by the end of May of the status of their grant request.
